

COVID-19 vaccination - what can you get?

IF YOU ARE...	YOU CAN GET...
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Aged 75+ or you live in a care home for older adults 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Two doses, at least eight weeks apart • Booster from three months (91 days) after second dose • Spring booster around 182 days (six months) after previous dose, unless invited earlier
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Aged 18 to 74 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Two doses, at least eight weeks apart • Booster from three months (91 days) after second dose
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Aged 16 to 17 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Two doses, at least 12 weeks apart • Booster from three months (91 days) after second dose
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Aged 12+ and you are, or have been, immunosuppressed 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Two doses, at least eight weeks apart • If severely immunosuppressed at the time of earlier doses, a third primary dose, typically eight weeks after second dose (timing may vary and should be discussed with a clinician) • Booster dose and spring booster from three months (91 days) after previous dose
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Aged 12-15 and with a health condition that puts you at higher risk from COVID-19, or you are a household contact of someone who is immunosuppressed 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Two doses, at least eight weeks apart • Booster from three months (91 days) after second dose
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Aged 12-15 and not in any of the above groups 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Two doses, at least 12 weeks apart • Booster dose under review
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Aged 5-11 with a health condition that puts you at higher risk from COVID-19, or you are a household contact of someone who is immunosuppressed 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Two doses, at least eight weeks apart • Booster dose under review

*From 4 April 22, healthy 5-11

Two doses, at least 12 weeks apart

You do not need to be registered with a GP or have an NHS number to get the vaccine
