The Board were able to meet in public and in person for the first time in July following the Covid-19 Pandemic

We relaunched our Lambeth Together pledge as a commitment, setting out our vision, values and behaviours as a Local Care Partnership



Children and Young People Alliance

The CYP Alliance hosted their away day in September, followed by a Deep Dive with an overview of the priorities and developments which was presented to the Board



Neighborhood & Wellbeing Delivery Alliance

Board received an update on the work of the NWDA - Living with Chronic pain and heard from patient focus groups



ICB Visit to Lambeth

Members of the Southeast London Integrated Care Board visited various partners within Lambeth, including Mosaic Club House, Tonic at Bankhouse, Angell Town Beacon Hub, The Crescent and Hitherfield Children's Centre, ending the day at Lambeth Civic Centre







An Integrated Care System

The Health and Care Bill became law which marked the formation of the Integrated Care Systems (ICS)



Living Well Network Alliance

Board members received an update on the Business Plan, the Patient and Carer Race Equality Framework (PCREF), Lambeth Talking Therapies, Culturally Appropriate Peer Support and Advocacy (CAPSA) and Emotional Emancipation Circles (EECs) at the November Board meeting





















OUR OFFER

In partnership with SEL ICS, we successfully delivered a multi-channel offer of the polio booster campaign to children aged 1 to 9.

OUR FEEDBACK

Community clinics were childfriendly and provided activities
to engage children whilst
waiting for their vaccination
and received very positive
feedback from families.
Children and their families also
valued the convenience of
accessing vaccinations within
the local community, including
libraries, pharmacies and
hospital trusts.

OUR IMPACT

The impact of the campaign included raising awareness and sensitising the population, particularly underserved communities, about vaccine preventable communicable diseases and the importance of vaccination.

OUR SUCCESS

Key to the campaign's success was the system collaboration and partnership working, including robust data sharing, which should be built on for future vaccination programmes, including improving the coverage of the routine childhood vaccination programme.

OUR ENGAGEMENT

Local delivery also included engagement with residents, particularly those with protected characteristics living in areas of high deprivation, to understand likely barriers with the view to resolving them. The goal for engagement activities were to address inequalities in vaccination uptake.

OUR DELIVERY

To date, the campaign delivered 7,619 vaccinations, of which more than 17% was delivered out of community clinics, which reinforces the need to apply trusted community assets when delivering NHS campaigns.



The Grassroots Programme was initially developed to address low vaccine uptake and vaccine hesitancy during the Covid-19 pandemic, but is now moving into phase 3 with additional organisations.

OUR IMPACT

We wanted to avoid traditional methods of communication as they are already in place but welcomed ideas that would enable a deep dive in communities to understand the lack of uptake of the vaccine and health and wellbeing issues.

We encouraged opportunities for discussion that speak to those communities that are most mistrustful of traditional methods of engagement.

DfE identified
Lambeth as the "gold standard" for HAF provision across
England following a visit by the
Permanent secretary for the DfE Susan Acland-Hood.

SCHOOL HOLIDAYS

School holidays can be a particular pressure point for families due to increased costs. The Department for Education funded HAF programme provides funding during the Spring, Summer and Winter schools holidays in 2022-25.



FUNDING

DfE have made additional funding available for the Winter HAF based upon an increase in the number of children on the FSM register. Lambeth have applied and were awarded a further £65K.

OUR REACH

- Over 47,900 attendances over the summer (10% higher than anticipated) – 2,700 funded places daily.
 - 70 attendees from refugee families Eritrea, Afghanistan,
 Congo, Ukraine, Iraq, El Salvador, Sierra Leone
 - 25,000 pieces of fresh fruit provided
 - 66,500 meals out for children and young people over the summer

OUR SUCCESS

The pilot has been successful in providing an alternative Peer support offer for Black Service users and we're expecting to expand this in 2023.

Inspire Health Event for Lambeth Residents

OUR EVENTS

The 'Inspire' Lambeth Festival took place in Brixton on Saturday 24th September and Kennington on 15 October. These successful one day events focused on the Health and Wellbeing of the Black Community to celebrate, inspire vitality and self-care and to give access to NHS Services.



OUR REACH

The event in the Peace Garden, St Matthew's Church Brixton, was led by The Brixton Project, funded by NHS England and was attended by around 200 people.

The event in St Mark's Church, Oval, that was led by Public Health, was attended by around 470 people.

OUR PARTNERS

Community Partners including Black Thrive, Carers4Careers, the Beacon Project and health partners including GSTT, provided exercise classes, health checks and mental health advice.

OUR COOKBOOK

Cookbook for the black community produced by Lambeth Public Health was given to attendees.

Lambeth together LAMBETH TOGETHER PROGRAMMES

Sexual Health

- Lambeth recognised nationally as an example of good practice
- Successfully launched the' Do It London campaign – Be Sure: Know the Four - https://doitlondon.org/
- Rapid roll out of Mpox vaccine in local sexual health services
- Abortion services reconfigured to continue to offer telemedical abortion to residents
- Secondary schools to deliver the relationships and sex education curriculum

Homeless Health

- Long-term complex rough sleepers reduced from 52 to 8 over past 2 years
- There is an approx. 53% reduction in the rough sleeping estimates in the borough over the past 2 years
- Successful tender of the new Emotional Wellbeing service – providing mental health interventions to homeless young people, children looked after and care leavers

Substance Misuse

- Established the Combating Drugs Partnership
- Joint working with the police using new MOPAC funding to address drugs markets as drivers of crime and exploitation.
- Additional investment via Treatment and Recovery Grant to expand treatment capacity
- 6 additional nurses recruited to work with complex caseloads, support vulnerable adults and women who have experienced violence and abuse, community and home detoxes
- Funding for aftercare support through a fund that individuals can apply to for support with travel costs to interviews for example or help with setting up a new home

Learning Disabilities & Autism

- Knights House a new supported living scheme for people with LD and/or autism based in Lambeth opened in August 2022
- LD Annual Health Checks exceeded 2021/22 national target of 75% during February and March 2022 – reached 80%
- Opening the Crescent ensuring completion of commission and commencement of operation
- Big Health Week in November 2022

 week-long interactive events with a face-to-face session in Lambeth
- Engagement on carers strategy and re-establishing strategic relationship with Learning Disability and Autism Assembly
